



LEAVE NO ANIMAL BEHIND

Sheltering in place with a generator and enough supplies for you and your pets for seven to ten days is often a very good option, but Long Island residents should be prepared to evacuate if necessary.

By June 2, every one of us who owns one of the 1,287,693 dogs and cats on Long Island should have prepared a “go kit” for their companion animals along with a secure carrier or crate

Be sure your companion animals are all wearing proper ID and you have developed emergency plans that include your pets

Here are two simple questions pet owners can ask themselves in order to prepare for a disaster with their companion animal:

- 1- How am I going to safely and securely transport my animals during a disaster?**
- 2- Where am I going to keep my animals while I am evacuated?**
